Shinran, the Founder of Jodo Shin Buddhism

In April, we observed *Hanamatsuri*, or Buddha Day, the birthday of Shakyamuni Buddha. We celebrated the Buddha's birthday because of the great benevolence of his Enlightenment, who came into the world to teach ordinary people like us about the Great Compassionate Vow of Amida Buddha.

In May, we observe and celebrate the birthday of Shinran Shonin, the founder of Shin Buddhism. This observance is called *Shuso Gotan-e*, or simply Gotan-e for short.

Shinran was born on May 21, 1173 in Hino, near Kyoto. He lost his mother at a very young age, and after his father abandoned the family to become a priest, Shinran decided also to become a priest. Accompanied by his uncle, young Matsuwaka-maro (as he was called then) went to the Shoren-in temple in Kyoto to be ordained by the priest, Jien. They arrived late at night, so Jien suggested that they wait until the morning before undergoing ordination. However, Shinran insisted that the *tonsure* be done that night, and so reportedly, he wrote this poem:

Cherry blossoms that are felt To last till the morrow' May well blow away During the night.

The world that Matsuwaka-maro knew was filled with strife, with continuous warfare for control of the country, a series of major earthquakes, widespread famine and disease. It was an extremely difficult time. That was the reason why young Matsuwaka-maro wrote that poem - the reason for the urgency in his obtaining tokudo, even though Jien was inconvenienced. Jien consented and he was ordained. The year was 1181, and he was just 9 years old.

Were it not for the life that Shinran was born into, perhaps he would not have sought answers to the deeper questions of life at such a young age. These unusual causes and conditions that Shinran went through, we are the beneficiates of the wonderful and rare life's work of this remarkable person.

After enduring difficult studies and practices, he found that he could not find the way to attain Perfect Enlightenment through his own efforts. At the age of 29, he was led to the Way of the Nembutsu by Honen Shonin and found the true path to the attainment of Buddhahood through the Wisdom and Compassion of Amida Buddha.

Jodo Shinshu Buddhists celebrate the birth of Shinran as the person who developed the True Pure land teaching gleaned from Shakyamuni in the Larger Sutra and made them meaningful for us, in all situations and all conditions, for all people regardless of age, physical or mental abilities.

Gotan-e (Shinran's Birthday) Service Guest Speaker May 15, 2022

Reverend Shigenori Makino is originally from Fukuoka, Japan and began his ministry in 1960 at the Sapporo Betsuin in Hokkaido, Japan.,

He received his Bachelor and Master of Arts degrees in Jodo Shinshu Buddhism from Ryukoku University in Kyoto Japan. He also obtained a Master of Science degree in Applied Psychology from Winona State University in Minnesota.

In 1964, Rev. Makino came to Hawaii and began 44 years of service to the Honpa Hongwanji Missions of Hawaii serving at Wailuku Hongwanji on Maui, and as resident

minister at Honpa Hongwanji Mission HI Betsuin, **Kailua Hongwanji** and Moiliili Hongwanji temples. He also served as Chief Advisor to the Bishop before retiring as an active minister of the Honpa Hongwanji Missions of Hawaii.

During those 44 years, Rev. Makino was also active in community service, volunteering as counselor and chaplain for various non-profit organizations and serving on advisory boards of the State Hospital Chaplaincy Program which included Kapiolani Children's Hospital; and as a board member of Project Dana.


Rev. Makino and his wife Sumie have two daughters, Megumi & Minori and two grandchildren, Graysen and Madisen.

STATEMENT BY THE JODO SHINSHU HONGWANJI-HA

Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawaii would like to share the statement on Russia's Invasion of Ukraine presented by Jodo Shinshu Hongwanji-ha in Kyoto, Japan. The statement was released on March 8, 2022.

Statement on Russia's Invasion of Ukraine

On February 24, 2022, Russia aggressively began its invasion of Ukraine through military force.

It has been reported that in cities across Ukraine, many civilians including children have become victims in addition to the well over one million Ukrainian citizens forced to flee becoming refugees.

We, the Jodo Shinshu Hongwanji-ha Buddhist organization, strongly condemn taking human life lightly as well as using military force to unilaterally try to change reality through violent actions for no matter what reason.

In addition to the invasion of Ukraine, the reality is that terrorist attacks and military warfare continue across the world. Reiterating our stance against violence, it is our fervent hope that a peaceful resolution may be realized as soon as possible and that there be a safe return to peace for the people of Ukraine.

Overcoming conflict that arises through mutual exclusion and differences in thinking and values, I firmly believe that through joint efforts, the path to perpetual peace will open up to a life of spiritual richness.
