OHIGAN – The Other Shore

The ocean of birth and death, of painful existence Has no bound; Only by the ship of Amida's Universal Vow Can we, who have long been drowning, Unfailingly be brought across it.

Namo Amida Butsu

On Sunday, September 25, the Windward Buddhist Temple and its membership, together with guests, will gather to observe the annual Autumn Ohigan Festival.

Ohigan occurs twice yearly, once in the Spring and again in the Fall. But it is one of the few religious holidays that did not originate with Shakyamuni Buddha. It began in Japan in the Asuka Period, (538-710 of the Common Era), presumably from the time of Prince Shotoku and is a distinctly Japanese observance. It is the vernal equinox, when both night and day are equal in length, and the world feels in balance and in comfortable harmony. In astronomy, Ohigan is the day when the sun rises directly from the East and sets directly in the West. This equinox appears again in the Spring.

Peoples of the many cultures throughout the world understood that nature was in perfect harmony and understood oneness of the universe. This harmony becomes apparent when we are able to see that which is beyond our limited and self-centered view of ourselves.

So, at this time of Ohigan, which is not a distant shore of Enlightenment, but in Jodo Shinshu is called "Sanbutsu-e" or "Gathering to Praise the Buddha". Let us all gather together to praise Amida Buddha's Wisdom and Compassion which leads us to the Other Shore and appreciate all that has been given to us as we reflect on our lives and especially at this time of Ohigan let us reflect on our interdependence with all of life itself, which is another way we can view Ohigan. Through the realization of interdependence, we become truly embraced by the Buddha which is what Namo Amida Butsu really means.

Rev. Daido Baba hails from Miyazaki prefecture Japan. Rev. Daido's home temple is in Chiba prefecture, and he has three older brothers who are also Buddhist ministers in Japan.

Rev. Baba began his ministerial journey in 2002 when he received his Tokudo ordination and that was followed in 2008 with his Kyoshi ordination. He attended Ryukoku University majoring in Jodo Shinshu and graduated in 2008 and received his Master's degree in 2010. He then worked at Nishi-Hongwanji in Kyoto until 2014, when he was assigned to Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawaii as a minister.

After serving as an associate minister at the Honpa Hongwanji Hilo Betsuin, he

relocated to Oahu and is currently the Executive Assistant to the Bishop of Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawaii at its headquarters.

Rev. Baba enjoys watching sports (especially soccer), playing tennis, skiing, hiking with his family and travelling (when he has time). Rev. and his wife Aki have three children; Dojun, Doken and Anna, who attend the Hongwanji Mission School.

BSC 50th ANNIVERSARY

On August 18, 1972, the Buddhist Study Center (BSC) opened its doors to the Public. It was the dream of former Bishop Kanmo Imamura to create a study center in Honolulu and, initially, with the assistance of the leaders of Hawaii Betsuin such as Mr. Richard Sasaki and individuals like Dr. Alfred Bloom that dream became a reality. Rev. Ryo Imamura and Rev. Tatsuo Muneto were the first co-directors of BSC in 1972. The present building on University Avenue was dedicated on August 20, 1995.
