Aloha and Namaste,

Please join us for the following special services:

On May 7th we will be observing Shinran Shonin's birthday (Gotane) The birthday of Shinran Shonin is commemorated on May 21 by followers of Jodo Shinshu throughout the world.

This day is very important, as it was Shinran who systematically developed the Nembutsu teaching by compiling the commentaries of the seven teachers whom he chose to call the Seven Patriarchs. The essence of the Jodo Shinshu teaching is contained in Shinran's Kyo-Gyo-Shin-Sho, compiled and written during his last years in the Kanto area, before his return to Kyoto.

Shinran Shonin teaches that we are able to attain salvation or Birth into the Pure Land. Even though Shinran (1173-1263) was born some 800 years ago, the Nembutsu teaching that he developed is still applicable to us in this modern Age of Technology.

What distinguishes his teaching is that it was meant primarily for householders, rather than those who left their homes to enter priesthood and attempt to follow the difficult path of discipline in search of Enlightenment. Without distinguishing between the priesthood and laity, he pointed out that everyone, without distinction of rank or class, would be saved by reciting the Nembutsu with Faith in Amida Buddha. In Shinran's teaching, there is no distinction between good and evil. Everyone is equal before the Buddha, and all can be equally saved by Amida's Compassion. This is Shinran Shonin's faith in the original vow of Amida Buddha. (*This article is from the West Los Angeles Buddhist Temple website*)

Another noteworthy day in the month of May is Mother's Day. Mother's Day is an occasion which is celebrated in various parts of the world to express respect, honor, and love towards mothers. This day is set aside to honor the contribution of our mothers, grandmothers, aunts and special friends to acknowledge the efforts of maternal bonds and the influential role of women in our lives.

And equally important is Father's Day, which we will observe in June. The first Father's Day was celebrated in 1910, but it took over 60 years for the holiday to become official. Since then, Father's Day has given us the opportunity to show love and appreciation toward the father figures in our lives. Whether you celebrate by giving gifts or spending quality time with your dad, Father's Day honors the men in our lives, fatherhood, and paternal influences.

We have the above three important days in the months of May and June which provide us time to reflect on those whose efforts have contributed to the lives we live today.




Decorating the yagura on the morning of the bon dance, Saturday, 7/8/2023 8:00 a.m. to noon. Hearty
